

Over Six Decades and Counting for Radio Legend Hal Jackson


At age 91, Hal Jackson is still going strong as the host of "Hal Jackson's Sunday Classics," on WBLS from 12 Noon to 4PM. "Doing radio keeps me going and I feel that I am still contributing. Each day I find that I'm a part of the world and I'm contributing, I'm happy to do it," he shared. Jackson has been in radio broadcasting for 65 years and in that time he has broken many racial barriers. He was the first African American sports announcer over WOOK in Washington, DC. He was one of a few who came together to acquire WLIB-AM in 1971, the first Black owned radio station. And, he was inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame in 1995.

Recently, Jackson with his wife of 18 years, Deborah, at his side, spoke to Harlem News about his amazing career. Discussing his incredible longevity in radio Jackson said, "Getting into radio, it was such a prejudice situation. You had to have a determination and be focused on what you were tying to do. My being in radio opened doors where I could look to have a determination and be focused on what you were tying to do. My being in radio opened doors where I could look out to help others. My longevity is due to the fact that I have learned to listen to everybody. I never eliminate anyone because you never know what they have to offer.

Jackson's Sunday afternoon show doesn't follow a rigid format or purpose, according to the broadcaster. "We stretch out because we are able to get a lot of people coming from different situations. We never did stick to any one kind of music. We could do Lena Horne, Nancy Wilson, or Dinah Washington – the idea is that it's a music show – spread it out." The radio host is proud of how his show's flexible format has impacted on the variety of listeners that tune in. They're from clubs, groups, organizations, and individuals. There is no age segment at all. We spread everything out so that everybody can feel that they are welcome and a part of it," Jackson said.

Jackson is thrilled to be a part of the event, especially having attended it five times in the past. 





Youth Development Foundation, Inc. Hal Jackson's Talented Teens International®

"Promoting Culture & Education through the Performing Arts"

Youth Development Foundation, Inc. (YDF) is a non-profit tax-exempt organization that promotes culture and education through the performing arts. Founded in 1971 by Hal Jackson, legendary radio personality and 2001 Broadcasting and Cable Hall of Fame inductee, YDF provides a support system for girls which offers exposure; encourages cross-culture exchange and nurtures emerging talent from around the world while providing training, educational scholarships and travel opportunities for young women

YDF showcases the intelligence and talents of girls 13 to 17 years of age from the United States and abroad. The program is open to all ethnic groups with an emphasis on diversity and intercultural awareness. Program participants typically are average or above students who have performing talents and want to use their gifts as a platform for attaining their secondary educational goals.

State and country programs are held from January through June in approximately 30 states and 10 countries. Area programs provide activities dedicated to youth, education and community involvement. Additionally as a part of each program, girls participate in a series of training sessions and local competitions where they are judged in categories demonstrating academic abilities, talent and stage presence. State and country winners move on to the international event – Hal Jackson's Talented Teens International (HJTTI) to compete to become Miss Talented Teen International.

The young ladies are brought together during International Week. They tour the competition city visit radio and/or television stations to learn about operations behind the scenes in the media industry visit restaurants to taste foods of different cultures attend Broadway shows and ultimately rehearse for their appearance on stage. Winners have received over \$1,000,000 in scholarships, prizes and inter-cultural trips abroad.

The Youth Development Foundation, Inc. via Hal Jackson's Talented Teens International assists in preventing drug abuse and pregnancy among youth by developing self-esteem and confidence, which is essential for the positive development of young ladies and success in all aspects of their lives.

1978

Each year thousands of young ladies walk through the doors of TTI sponsors around the world. The winner's door opened for Miss Connecticut, Shoul Piland and she was crowned by Michael Jackson at the Coconut Grove in Los Angeles.



1979

Prizes for the winners include scholarships, exposure to the music and film industries, and travel abroad which enhances cultural awareness. *Dween Davis*, an accomplished violinist took the crown on stage at the Apollo in New York City.



1987

Cool breezes blew through the hair of the TTI contestants when they visited St. Croix, St. John and performed live in St. Thomas. The winning contestant was Tammy, Townsend who hails from Carson, California



1988

The age of entering contestants was raised to 17. The TTI contest was held at the Arie Crown Theatre and Kinga Dawn Windon a gymnast from New Jersey stole the judges' hearts.



1989

TTI was designed as an outlet for untapped talent as well as training in staging, choreography, poise, grace, and diction. Tamica Ellis, a young lady from Wisconsin possessed all of those qualities and won on the Apollo stage in Harlem, U.S.A.
