Black History Month 2010 - NY Daily News - Fab Five New York Living Legends By David Hinckley

Hal Jackson Through creativity and courage, he helped change the business of radio

Three decades before Barack Obama was born, Hal Jackson was living by the optimistic principle, "Yes, we can." Today, almost eight decades into his media career and a couple of months past his 94th birthday, Jackson is one of those pioneers who can say, "Yes, we did." It's not all perfect, he'll tell you. There's still work to do. But America is a very different place now than it was when Hal Jackson was born in South Carolina in 1915. On the other hand, looking back has never been Jackson's style. His gaze has always been focused forward, and that's one reason he has seen a lot of things come true that the rest of the world told him were not possible. The first, and still in many ways the most basic, came in the late 1930s, when he walked into the offices of Washington radio station WINX, then owned by the Washington Post. Jackson came in with some credentials. Raised in D.C., he had graduated from Howard University. He was fluent in sports and music, with experience announcing both. So he felt he could do a show, he told the general manager, that would bring the station listeners from Washington's sizeable and growing black population. He would also bring advertisers who wanted to reach other listeners. The general Manager, Jackson later recalled, responded by saying, "No n---- will ever go on this radio station." Jackson left the interview and found a white advertising agency that would buy 15 minutes of time every night for a show ambiguously titled, "The Bronze Review." The general manager was so happy to sell it to the agency he didn't even ask who would be on the air. So imagine his surprise when he realized it was Hal Jackson. By that time, the station had gotten such a positive response Jackson was too valuable to lose. Yes, he could. Today, Jackson still hosts a radio show, "Sunday Classics," from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. weekly on WBLS (107.5 FM) with his wife, Debi, and his long-time partner, Clay Berry. He jokes that his memory isn't quite what it used to be, nor is his hearing, which is mostly gone. He sleeps later these days, and it has been a while since he worked 40-hour weeks at WBLS. He has definitely made his mark on the industry, which recognized his contributions by inducting him into the Radio Hall of Fame in 1995. And in 203, he looked back at his career in his autobiography, "The House

That Jack Built," published by Colossus Books. And he's still in the game. In addition to working at WBLS he oversees the Talented Teens International competition, which he started years ago to provide an outlet and incentive for teens to develop their skills. "The most important thing I do is the community work," he says. That has meant everything from coat and food drives to working the airwaves and the streets the night Dr. Martine Luther King, Jr. Was killed, telling everyone that the way to honor King's memory was not to destroy but to build. One of many things Jackson helped build was WBLS and its sister radio station, WLIB. He and Percy Sutton joined in 1971 to form Inner City Broadcasting Corp., and Jackson persuaded Sutton that in addition to WLIB, the company should also buy its then - unimportant sister WLIB-FM - which became WBLS and, within the decade, the No. 1 station in the city. That's the kind of trail Jackson has regularly broken, in places where the brush has rarely been cleared. At one point in the early 1950s, he was hosting three daily shows on three radio stations: a pop music show on WMCA, a rhythm and blues show on WNJR and an all-night jazz show on WABC, where he became the first black host of a nationally syndicated program. Perhaps his most enduring legacy from those years was from the smallest station, WNJR, where that exotic rhythm and blues music was laying the foundation for rock 'n' roll. Later in the 1950s at WABC, he became one of the first black jocks on mainstream top 40. He did other things along the way, such as became one of the first black TV show hosts with "Uncle Hal's Kiddle Show." Years before that, in Washington in the early 1940s, he started a top black basketball team - the Washington Bears - because he figured it would be a good complement to his young career as a radio sportscaster calling games for the Negro League Homestead Grays from Washington's Griffith Stadium. But if you ask Jackson's colleagues, they will tell you his greatest legacy lies in radio. To a man and a woman, they will say Jackson's determination opened many of the doors through which they walk today. He went from being banned from a radio station to owning a radio station, from looking into the radio world to sitting on top of it. And he's still sitting there today. Yes, he can.





















The Youth Development Foundation

<u>Program Overview</u>

Youth Development Foundation, Inc. Hal Jackson's Talented Teens International®

"Promoting Culture & Education through the Performing arts"

The Youth Development Foundation (YDF), a non-profit organization, designed and launched the Hal Jackson Talented Teens International (HJTTI) program in 1971 with the mission to promote education and culture through the arts. Over the years, HJTT has played an instrumental role in cultivating and supporting the academic achievement and artistic growth of over 25,000 underserved and impoverished young minority women between the ages of 13 to 17. Over 90% of the young women that participated in the HJTT program have gone on to graduate high school and college. YDF through the HJTT program operates in the United States, Caribbean, Canada and Africa impacting the lives of over 500 young women each year.

Founded in 1971 by Hal Jackson, legendary broadcaster and 2001 Broadcasting and Cable Hall of Fame inductee, HJTTI provides a support system for girls and encourages cross-cultural exchange and nurtures emerging talent. HJTTI provides the young ladies with training, awards educational scholarships and gives travel opportunities. This program is open to all ethnic groups with an emphasis on diversity and intercultural awareness.

State and country programs are held from January through June in approximately 30 states and 10 countries. Area programs provide activities dedicated to youth, education and community involvement. Additionally, as a part of each program, girls participate in a series of training sessions and local activities. They are judged in categories demonstrating academic abilities, talent and stage presence. State and country winners move on to the international event to compete to become named Miss Hal Jackson's Talented Teen International.

Area competition winners are convened to participate in the international week of activities. They tour the competition city; visit radio and/or television stations where they learn about operations behind the scenes in the media industry; visit restaurants to taste foods of different cultures; attend professional theatrical performances and ultimately rehearse for their appearance on stage. Winners have received over \$1,500,000 in scholarships, prizes and inter-cultural trips abroad. Some of the individuals who have donated their time include Patti LaBelle, Aretha Franklin, Janet Jackson, Alicia Keys, Fantasia, Boyz II Men, Musiq, Smokey Robinson, Denzel Washington, Robert Townsend, Brian McKnight and Michael Jackson.

The Youth Development Foundation, Inc. through Hal Jackson's Talented Teens International assists in preventing drug abuse and pregnancy among youth by developing self-esteem and confidence, which is essential for the positive development of young ladies and success in all aspects of their lives.

A number of HJTTI participants have become acclaimed professionals including Civic Court Judges, Award Winning Writers, Oscar Nominated Actresses, Principals and Deputy Borough Presidents. The YDF has a high success rate of young ladies graduating from college with participants and competition finalists completing undergraduate programs a Yale, Stanford, Columbia and NYU.

This year, we were able to employ more teens part-time and one full-time. And this fall, we will be offering Self Esteem Workshops to young ladies 13 to 17; you don't have to guess where that inspiration came from. Congratulations, Miss Talented Teen International Family for 39 years! I can truly say that being a contestant and a winner was an experience of a lifetime and I will cherish the memories forever. 
Hal Jackson's Talented Teens International 2006

Kimberly Brooks


